Armenian authorities strongly denied that a French company, Orano Company, has been secretly transporting nuclear waste to Armenia for storage.

The government of the Republic of Armenia characterized the article as part of an ongoing hybrid war against Armenia.

"This is an attack on Armenia's sovereignty, statehood, foreign policy, independence. and democracy," wrote Ministry of Environment and the Press Secretary, Nazely Baghdasaryan. "The goal is clear: to damage Armenia's international reputation and, in this case, to cast a shadow over our strategic partnership with France...certain centers are essentially revealing their discomfort with Armenia's current path...This is further proof that the direction Armenia has taken is the right one...Armenia will not deviate from that path, no matter how many fake articles or information attacks are launched."

With a new era of AI and spread of fake news, many people cannot tell what news is fake and what news is real. This causes a lot of confusion and misunderstanding about important social political issues. That is exactly why some faceless, nameless and odorless 'forces and centers' want to create in Armenia.

AGBU Central Board's Statement on Events in Armenia



The Armenian nation is at a moment of deep crisis. Recent events are sending shockwaves through Armenia and across our expansive Diaspora. As we have at critical junctures in the Nation's history, AGBU is speaking out to call for restraint and national unity.

As events unfold, it is important to reinforce that the Constitution of the Republic of Armenia and its democratic process must be respected, as should the clear governance, policies and protocols of the national Church with its global following.

The government's primary rights and obligations are to tend to the governing policies and the enforcement of the laws in Armenia, within the limits of the democratic process and respecting individuals' rights to free speech. At the same time, the Church has the rights and obligation to tend to the spiritual leadership and authority of the global Armenian nation from East to West, including Armenia.

Both the Constitution and the Law "On Freedom of Conscience and Religious Organizations" clearly delineate the roles and responsibilities of the State and the Armenian Apostolic Holy Church. While constructive criticism of — or disagreement with — any institution or its leadership is reasonable, unconstitutional interference and destructive rhetoric are not.

Just as the current government works to secure peace and prosperity for Armenia and its citizens, the Armenian Apostolic Church is the bedrock of our faith and national identity for Armenians across the globe. The Church has been the guiding force for more than 1700 vears in enduring empires. kingdoms, totalitarian regimes, and even the attempt to systematically eliminate our people during the Armenian Genocide.

We urge all parties to exercise restraint, reject divisiveness, and recommit to dialogue grounded in mutual respect and shared national interest. We must move forward together for in unity is strength and only in unity can we hope to overcome the challenges that lie ahead.

Nasrudin turned to his son and said, "Son, people will judge you no matter what you do, so you may as well do what you want!"


Monthly 'pizza outing' for ARHNJ volunteers



Turkish MPs propose naming Armenia border checkpoint after Talaat Pasha

A group of Turkish lawmakers has submitted a controversial proposal to rename the "Alican—Margara" country's future border with Armenia, Talaat Pasha. This proposal is supported by 28 out of 600 members of the Turkish parliament.

The proposal has triggered strong backlash from genocide scholars and Armenian advocacy groups. Talaat Pasha oversaw the planned extermination of over 1.5 million Armenians, the destruction of more than 2,000 churches, and the violent uprooting of communities from their ancestral lands.



Emmanuel Macron Reaffirms France's Support for Armenia's Democratic Stability and Regional Peace Efforts



YEREVAN — Armenian Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan held a phone conversation with French President Emmanuel Macron on Sunday, during which they discussed bilateral relations between Armenia and France, as well as regional and international issues.

"I had a very good phone conversation with the Prime Minister of Armenia," Macron wrote on his

X (formerly Twitter) account, adding, "I expressed France's solidarity in the face of attempts to destabilize Armenian democracy."

The French President also reaffirmed his support for Prime Minister Pashinyan's "courageous efforts to establish peace with Azerbaijan and normalize relations with Turkey."

"Peace and open borders would represent a major step forward for the entire region and serve as an example beyond," Macron emphasized.

ENA staffers engaged in political collusions to be fired, says PM



Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan vowed on Wednesday that staffers of

the national electric utility (ENA) who are engaged in "political collusions" instead of fulfilling their duties will be fired from their positions in July.

Those who are coercing ENA employees to attend rallies will also be fired, he said

"ENA staffers who are resisting these two groups and remain committed to their duties will not have any problems," Pashinyan said. He said that those who will get unlawfully fired by the current ENA executives for not submitting to their coercion will be reinstated later.

ENA is run by Tashir Group, a conglomerate owned by Russian-Armenian billionaire tycoon Samvel Karapetyan who is currently under criminal investigation for allegedly advocating an overthrow of government.

Union of Armenians in Greece condemns coup plot, backs Armenian Government

The Union of Armenians in Greece has expressed support for the democratically elected authorities of the Republic of Armenia and condemned the actions of groups allegedly sponsored by foreign forces. In a statement, the Union condemned plans to plot an alleged armed coup against the legitimate government.

"It is appropriate to recall that the forces plotting the coup are the same circles that are, in some way, interconnected with those responsible for the terrorist attack on the National Assembly of the Republic of Armenia on October 27, 1999," the statement reads. "During that attack, eight high-ranking officials were killed, including the Prime Minister, the Speaker of the National Assembly, Deputy Speakers, ministers, and deputies."

The Union noted that former officials, who ordered the shooting of protesters in Yerevan in 2008 and have not yet been held accountable for the deaths of ten citizens, were preparing to carry out a coup using similar methods, either directly or through covert means.

According to the statement the current authorities, elected in December 2018 and re-elected in the June 2021 snap elections with over 70% and 50% of the vote respectively, represent a democratically elected government. The Union condemned all illegal

actions and disinformation campaigns, both domestic and international, that aim to present the arrests and prosecutions of coup conspirators as political persecution.

The Union also stressed that all political forces in Armenia have the opportunity to participate in the 2026 parliamentary elections and present their activities to the judgment of the people.

"The Union of Armenians in Greece believes that the attempted coup against Armenia's legitimate government is a foreign-sponsored encroachment on the country's sovereignty and territorial integrity. The accompanying information campaigns are nothing more than attempts to divert international public opinion and attention," the statement concluded.

Unacceptable and unfriendly actions by Azerbaijani law enforcement agencies against the Russian news agency



Azerbaijani Ambassador Rahman Mustafayev was summoned to the Russian Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA) on Tuesday. During a meeting with Deputy Foreign Minister of the Russian Federation Mikhail Galuzin, the Azeri ambassador was conveyed a note of protest regarding Baku's recent unfriendly actions, deliberate steps by the Azerbaijani side to deteriorate

bilateral relations with Russia. These include the cancellation of high-level events within the framework of the [Russia-Azerbaijan] interstate dialogue, the Russophobic campaign unleashed in the Azerbaijani media at the instigation of the [Azerbaijani] authorities. the provocative. unacceptable actions taken Azerbaijani law enforcement agencies against the Russian news agency Sputnik Azerbaijan and its employees, the cancellation of all cultural events in the [Azerbaijani] republic, with the participation of performers, including children's creative groups, who arrived from Russia," the Russian MFA statement adds.

Videos and images of beaten detained Russian IT workers and businessmen have surfaced, showing that they were so badly beaten that it impossible to identify some of the detainees because of bruises.

The Azerbaijani ambassador was handed a verbal note demanding the immediate release of Russian journalists Igor Kartavikh and Yevgeny Belousov. The Russia Today media group reported that members of the editorial staff who hold Azerbaijani citizenship were also among those detained. The Kremlin hopes to have them released through direct contacts with Baku.

Deaths of two Azerbaijanis in the Russian city of Yekaterinburg



Azerbaijan has cancelled all cultural events planned by Russian state and private institutions in protest over the deaths of two Azerbaijanis after police raids in the Russian city of Yekaterinburg, Azerbaijani officials said Sunday.

The Azerbaijani Foreign Ministry demanded an immediate investigation into the case and bringing those responsible for this unacceptable act of violence to justice as soon as possible.

The victims were identified as Ziyaddin and Huseyn Safarov, both around 60 years old. Their brother, Sayfaddin Huseynli.

Azerbaijani public broadcaster ITV that the men were tortured to death "without any trial or investigation, despite their innocence." He described the raids as "savagery," claiming that others were beaten and subjected to electric shocks.

Azerbaijani government also announced the cancellation of a planned visit by Russian Deputy Prime Minister Alexey Overchuk.

The bodies of the Safarov brothers will be transported to Azerbaijan. Russian Foreign Ministry spokeswoman Maria Zakharova said Saturday that the raids formed part of an investigation into previously committed crimes. Zakharova said raids and detentions targeted Russian citizens of Azerbaijani descent.

Ties between the two countries have been strained for months. Azerbaijani President Ilham Aliyev declined an invitation to attend Russia's Victory Day parade in Moscow in May. In contrast, Ukraine's Foreign Minister Andrii Sybiha visited Baku later that month, signaling closer ties between Baku and Kyiv.


Angela Sarafyan in the upcoming film Superman, directed by James Gunn


