Turkish government is moving quickly to capitalize on TRIPP rail corridor



The Turkish government is moving quickly to capitalize on new economic opportunities created by US President Donald Trump's peace plan for Armenia and Azerbaijan.

Turkish officials held a groundbreaking

ceremony on August 22 for a new 224-km rail line stretching from eastern Turkish hub of Kars to Dilucu at the frontier with Azerbaijan's Nakhchivan exclave. The Kars-Dilucu rail line is envisioned as the largest section of a new transit corridor that is the centerpiece of the Trump peace plan. The new route would be initially capable of handling up to 15 million metric tons of

freight and 5.5 million passengers per year.

Political analysts in Turkey are wondering whether the groundbreaking ceremony actually marked the start of construction or was merely a symbolic gesture tied to Turkey's domestic political agenda.

Ankara did conduct tenders for consultancy work on the Kars-Dilucu route in late 2024, but according to Turkey's state tendering and contract database, contracts have yet to be awarded. And there is no sign vet of a tender for actual construction work on the line.

The project does officially exist. It has been listed in Turkey's investment program since 2022 at an estimated cost of \$3.4 billion, of which \$2.7 expected to from external credit. But of those totals, only \$61 million has so far been allocated, of which \$50 million is designated as external credit.

Also unclear is what will happen to the existing rail links between Turkey, Armenia and Azerbaijan?

to Prior the Soviet collapse and the outbreak the Armenian-Azerbaijani conflict in the late 1980s, there was a direct rail link from Kars to the Armenian capital Yerevan and from Yerevan to the Azerbaijani capital Baku. The bulk of those lines are believed to be still requiring operational only border sections to be refurbished and reopened.





Ambassador Lilit Makunts ends four year service

A farewell reception was held in the Armenian embassy in Washington D.C. on August 22, in honor of Armenian ambassador to the U.S. Lilit Makunts.

Makunts ended her four-year service with significant contributions to bilateral security cooperation between Armenia and the U.S.

In her farewell speech, reflecting on her four-year tenure, Ambassador Makunts highlighted the signing of the historic peace agreement between Armenia and Azerbaijan on August 8 in Washington, D.C., as a key event facilitated through the mediation of U.S. President Donald Trump.



Pashinyan names Lilit Makunts for new chief advisor

Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan announced on Thursday that Lilit Makunts, the former Armenian Ambassador to the United States, will serve as his chief advisor.

Makunts left her ambassadorial post on August 27 and was replaced by Narek Mkrtchyan.



Armenia appoints new Ambassador to the United States

Narek Mkrtchyan has been appointed Armenian Ambassador to the United States, replacing Lilit Makunts. Mkrtchyan served as Minister of Labor and Social Affairs since 2021 until this appointment.



Pashinyan: What Israeli PM said has nothing to do with interests of either Armenia or Armenian people

"It is obvious that Netanyahu's statement has nothing to do with the interests of either the Republic of Armenia or the people, or the Armenian people. And, in general, we need to understand: do we want the recognition or non-recognition of the Armenian Genocide to be a geopolitical coin in the hands of others. Do we want the Armenian Genocide to be something expressed in an interview as a result of coincidence or confusion? I do not want us to put our martyrs in such a status. We must focus on the interests of our state. Is it our objective to give others the opportunity to use our martyrs as a means of payment in geopolitical trade? The main the main motivation for many world leaders for recognizing the Armenian Genocide was to get more votes in political elections, and that has nothing to do with the interests of of Armenia." people Pashinyan.



Annual Conference of Armenia's Diplomatic Missions Abroad Held in Kapan





Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan and President Vahagn Khachaturyan attended the annual conference of the heads of Armenia's diplomatic missions abroad, held in Kapan.

The opening remarks were delivered by Foreign Minister Ararat Mirzoyan, who emphasized the significance of this year's conference, convened under a new reality for Armenia and the region—one marked by the establishment of peace.

In his address, Prime Minister Pashinyan highlighted the crucial role importance ofArmenia's diplomatic missions. He noted that the government has been pursuing a balanced foreign policy, the practical implementation of which was achieved on August 8 in Washington, D.C., with the peace agreement between Armenia and Azerbaijan. The Prime Minister also touched upon the fundamental directions of Armenia's foreign policy, country's priorities international relations, and upcoming programs.



President Khachaturyan described August 8—the initialing of the peace agreement between Armenia and Azerbaijan in Washington—as one of the greatest achievements in Armenia's modern diplomatic history. He stressed that this milestone is reshaping the entire region, shifting from a logic of war and militarization toward one of


peace, economic development, and prosperity.

Following the Prime Minister's and President's address, participants engaged in discussions on key foreign policy issues, examining current challenges and potential solutions.

David Barsamian: Big corporations control what Americans hear, see and read



"Big corporations control what Americans hear, see and read. Corporate media are largely weapons of mass distraction. Language is manipulated to manufacture consent and to limit the bounds of permissible thought. You need to come up with positive alternatives that give people hope, that's one reason I started Alternative Radio out of my house many years ago."

David Barsamian!

Barsamian was born in New York in 1945 to refugees who had fled the Turkish genocide of Armenians. Though they didn't have much education, they were able to open their own grocery store in New York. The family lived above the store. As the child of immigrant parents, Barsamian grew up with a strong sense of international issues.

In 1978, Barsamian took on a volunteer role at KGNU community radio in Boulder, Colorado. Over eight years at KGNU, he learned the essentials of radio journalism - interviewing, writing, producing, on-air skills. He even edited reel-to-reel tape with razor blades and wax pencils. He hosted and produced two shows, "Ganges to the Nile," an international music program, "Hemispheres," a political program. In 1986, he uplinked a twoand-a-half hour interview with Noam Chomsky to the public radio satellite. Though most radio stations preferred half-hour or one-hour segments, a few stations picked up the interview. That long conversation with Chomsky was the beginning of Alternative Radio.

Barsamian never forgot the suffering his parents experienced before they came to America. He interviewed some of the witnesses of the Armenian genocide, including his mother, Araxie. Though he wanted very much to know about his mother's experiences, it was painful to make her revisit memories of death and destruction. He describes those interviews as the most difficult of his career. However, as he did them, he discovered that the uncomfortable interviews helped him and his mother deal with the difficult personal and political history. Barsamian's experience interviewing his mother showed him how important it is to listen to unheard voices; not only are those voices important to true democracy, they give the speaker an opportunity to heal through communication.

Barsamian has received honors for his work, including awards from the American Civil Liberties Union. the Lannan Foundation, the Institute for Journalism, Alternative Radical Desi, and the Rocky Mountain Peace and Justice Center. He lectures on affairs, imperialism, world capitalism, propaganda, the media and global rebellions, and he has collaborated with the renowned Kronos Quartet in events in New York, London, Vienna, Boulder and San Francisco.

And after fifty years, Barsamian continues to carry out the mission of Alternative Radio, delivering the stories and perspectives that are ignored by the corporate media.

Armenia, Pakistan to consider establishing diplomatic relations, says FM Ishaq Dar



Pakistan's Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar said on Friday that he spoke by phone with Armenian Foreign Minister Ararat Mirzoyan and they agreed to consider establishing diplomatic relations between the two countries.

"Foreign Minister of the Republic of Armenia, H.E. Ararat Mirzoyan and I held a cordial conversation on phone today, and agreed to consider establishing diplomatic relations between Pakistan and Armenia," Ishaq Dar said in a post on X.






