# Armenian Radio Hour of NJ (ARHNJ) interviews Ara Kochunyan





He held key positions under the Kennedy and Johnson

Administrations: from Assistant Secretary of the Army and Under Secretary of the Army, to Assistant Secretary of Defense and Secretary of the Navy.

Following his government service, Ignatius played important roles in the private sector: President of The Washington Post, President of the Air Transport Association, and founder of his own management-consulting firm.

His connection to AGBU was deeply personal. His grandfather, Avedis

Jamgochian, founded the first AGBU branch in Manchester, England, and the legacy of fostering Armenian community and culture lives on in Ignatius's own story. To learn about his distinguished career and inspired life, read the exclusive interview with him in the 2017 issue of AGBU Magazine.

His life stood as a testament to the ideals of integrity, service, and timeless values rooted in his Armenian American identity—honoring his ethnic heritage while sharing his gifts for the good of his native country. ### Pashinyan: Negotiation Papers to Be Published Before Year's End



Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan announced that the negotiation papers will be made public before the end of the year, responding to recent interviews given by former Armenian Presidents Robert Kocharyan and Serzh Sargsyan.

"The recent statements by R.K. and S.S. confirm once again that the Karabakh issue was used by certain forces as a leash to tie the Republic of Armenia to a 'nearby tree.' Concepts

such as the rights of peoples and historical justice were merely smoke screens to conceal the real objective," the Prime Minister wrote on his Facebook page.

"All the proposals to stop the war were, in fact, about shortening that leash. The ultimate goal of this process was to bring an end to Armenia's statehood. According to that script, the Karabakh conflict was supposed to conclude only through the loss of Armenian statehood. The Republic of Armenia, thanks to the sacrifices of our martyrs and the historical awareness of our people in Armenia and Karabakh, managed to escape that scenario," Pashinyan stated.

In recent days, Armenia's second and third presidents have given interviews

discussing the 44-day war and the negotiation process. In his interview with TV5, Robert Kocharvan said: "To me, it was clear that everything was being done to provoke a war. First of all, this was the result of the failure of the negotiation process, occurred which at Armenia's initiative—Armenia refused negotiate. For the first time in the entire negotiation process, one of the sides refused even to discuss the submitted document. That document was presented in the summer of 2019. At the time, Nikol Pashinvan said that we would start from a zero point and let negotiations be held with Karabakh. By refusing to negotiate the 2019 document, he effectively erased nearly 30 years of negotiation progress."

# Twenty killed in Turkish military plane crash in Georgia after leaving Azerbaijan



20 military personnel traveling on a Turkish C-130 cargo plane, on Tuesday, crashed in Georgia, have been killed according to the Turkish government. The plane had taken off from Azerbaijan and was on its way back to Turkey when it crashed.

Video footage aired on news outlets appeared to show the aircraft spiralling down and leaving a trail of white smoke.

Turkey's President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan said he was "deeply saddened" and expressed his condolences for those killed in the crash.

A search and rescue operation has been launched in coordination with Azerbaijani and Georgian authorities.

The C-130E Hercules is widely used by Turkey's armed forces for transporting personnel and conducting logistical operations.

# Paul Ignatius, Former U.S. Navy Secretary and Glendale Native, Dies at 104



Paul R. Ignatius, a management consultant who served as Secretary of the Navy during the height of the Vietnam War, died on November 6 at his home in Washington. He was 104.

His son, David Ignatius — a journalist and novelist for The Washington Post — confirmed his father's passing but did not specify a cause.

Born in Glendale, California, in 1920 to Armenian immigrant parents, Paul Ignatius's remarkable life reflected the values of hard work, service, and civic pride instilled in him by his family and community. His family settled in Glendale in 1911, where his grandfather built their first home on San Fernando Road — the same street that now houses the Paul Ignatius Post Office, named in his honor

through federal legislation championed by Congressman Adam Schiff in 2024.

Ignatius attended and graduated from Herbert Hoover High School in 1938, where he was active in student leadership, serving as both class president and student body president.

On May 23, 2013, the U.S. Navy announced that an Arleigh Burke–class destroyer, the USS Paul Ignatius (DDG-117), would be named in his honor. The ship was commissioned at Port Everglades, Florida, on July 27, 2019.

As a young man, Ignatius worked as a clerk at that same Glendale post office while attending college, never imagining that decades later it would bear his name. He often said that his Glendale upbringing shaped his commitment to public service and instilled a lifelong gratitude toward the community that gave his family its start.

During World War II, Ignatius served with distinction as an ordnance officer in the U.S. Navy. His dedication and leadership eventually led him to



become the 59th U.S. Secretary of the Navy under President Lyndon B. Johnson — making him the highestranking Armenian American in U.S. government history. He also served in senior positions under Presidents John F. Kennedy and Johnson within the Department of Defense, where he oversaw critical advancements in national defense and naval modernization.

Beyond his government service, Ignatius was a respected leader in business, academia, and philanthropy. He remained deeply connected to his Armenian heritage and to his hometown of Glendale, inspiring generations through his humility, wisdom, and devotion to both country and community.

# 1,734,247 Tourists Visited Armenia in January–September 2025



More tourists visited Armenia between January and September 2025

compared to the same period last year, according to the Statistical Committee of Armenia.

During the reporting period, Armenia welcomed 1,734,247 tourists, up from 1,721,245 visitors recorded in the same months of the previous year.

The largest number of tourists came from Russia — 713,479 visitors. Other major sources included Iran (138,010), Georgia (210,247), Turkey (9,115), and

Azerbaijan (3). From the United States, 50,599 tourists visited Armenia, followed by China (34,446), Germany (25,699), Ukraine (20,171), and India (20,843).

Tourists also arrived from several dozen other countries, including France, Italy, the United Kingdom, Poland, Japan, Jordan, South Korea, Fiji, Denmark, Egypt, and Bangladesh.

# One new postage stamp dedicated to the theme "Prominent Armenians. 100th Anniversary of Ofelya Hambardzumyan"



On November 12th, 2025, one postage stamp dedicated to the theme "Prominent Armenians. 100th Anniversary of Ofelya Hambardzumyan" has been put into circulation.

The postage stamp with the nominal value of 320 AMD depicts the prominent Armenian singer, the People's Artist of the Armenian SSR Ofelya Hambardzumyan (1925-2016).

The postage stamp also depicts the inscriptions "OFELYA HAMBARDZUMYAN" and "ARMENIAN SINGER" in Armenian and English languages.

The postage stamp was cancelled by the Deputy Minister of Education, Science, Culture and Sport of the Republic of Armenia Daniel Danielyan, the Chief Executive Officer of "Haypost" CJSC Shushan Aleksanyan, the member of the Board of "Haypost" CJSC Karen Margaryan, the President of the Philatelists' Armenian Association Hovik Musayelyan.

# Pennies are being canceled and the US Mint won't make any more

President Trump ordered the Treasury Department, back in February, to stop minting pennies. His argument – that pennies cost more to mint than they are worth. Producing 4.5 billion pennies in Fiscal Year 2023 cost taxpayers more than \$179 million.

That's not an alternative fact: The U.S. Mint said in its annual report that each penny costs 3.69 cents to make.
